Communication and Language

Children begin using language well, consistently using new vocabulary throughout the day. We begin to encourage and model the use of how and why questions during new stories/learning. Children continue to learn new rhymes and songs, and may make up their own songs and use the stage to perform. We engage in nonfiction books showing an understanding of new knowledge and vocabulary learnt. Children may join in with the school prayer and use new vocabulary from Worship sessions. Children will show a deeper understanding, participating in discussions and answering questions during whole school Worships.

Understanding the World

Children access learning both indoors and outdoors. At the beginning of the spring term we focus on being healthy and safe in our own environment. Still linking into looking after our environment, we move our learning forward by looking at how to keep our bodies healthy and how to cross the roads safely.

Expressive Arts

Children have access to a rich open ended learning environment which provides lots of opportunities for exploring role play, art, construction, and craft. For more details, please see the long-term plan.

Physical Development
